CONTROL TOWER WINS BDC ENHANCEMENT AWARD

The winners, for the 30th year of the Broadland Enhancement Award, have been decided with Nelson Barn in Salhouse and the Control Tower in Rackheath taking the top awards.



There were two categories within the enhancement awards - for domestic and commercial buildings.

The Old Control Tower at Rackheath had reached a state of extreme dereliction and might have been demolished as an "eyesore". Its transformation into offices has been carried out with careful regard for the character and history of the building.

The judges were impressed by the developer's commitment to rescue a building which could quite easily have been lost, not being protected by listing or conservation area status, and by the research that had been carried out to ensure that the refurbished building matched as closely as possible its original form and appearance.

"The Broadland Enhancement Award recognises and awards conversions, alterations or extensions to existing buildings in the Broadland District," said
